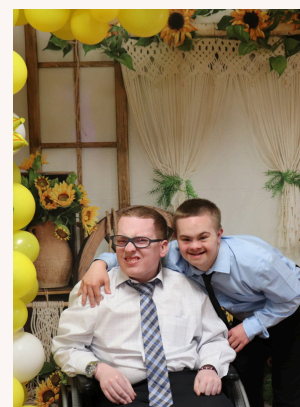
The Massachusetts National Guard Visits BICO

Bridgewater State University's CityLab Science Outreach Program



Last month, Bico's STAP, TEP, AMS, and Learning Center programs participated in Bridgewater State University's CityLab science outreach program, which provided hands-on, inquiry-based laboratory activities using state-of-the-art equipment.

The students participated in two activities that explored hereditary disease testing and forensic analysis. The students practiced micro pipetting skills and performed DNA fingerprinting analysis on samples, used techniques that are based on restriction fragment length polymorphism (RFLP) and used agarose gel electrophoresis to resolve DNA fingerprints. The students honed their data analysis and critical thinking skills while solving mysteries, and had a ton of fun!

Families, staff and students district-wide as well as alumni Special Olympics athletes also attended the event in support of student-athletes.

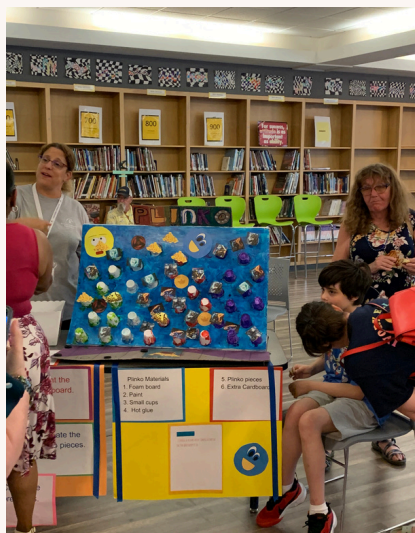


LREP Students Hosts Animal Adventures Family Zoo & Rescue Center

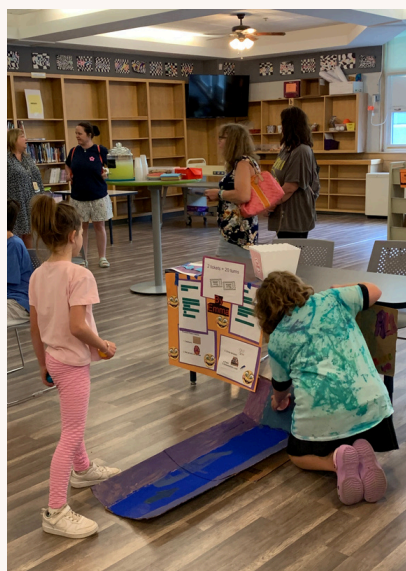
SEAP Students Build Cardboard Carnival

On June 7, students in BICO's SEAP program participated in a cardboard carnival.

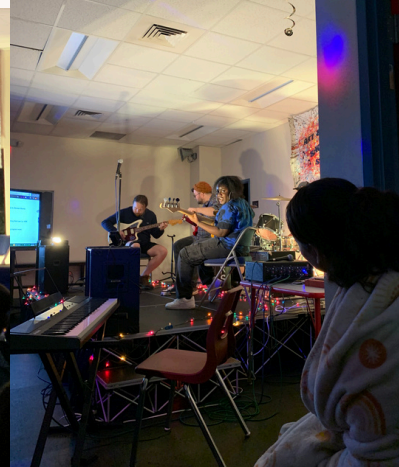
At the beginning of the month, each student chose a carnival game to create. Students worked during class to create a list of materials, building instructions, and instructions on how to play.
